

### **The Evil Eye:**

Started out as a Kinetic Sculpture Racer in 2003 (see other photos). It "Aced" the Arcata race winning a 3rd place in engineering for the rear wheel that converted to a fat sand tire, paddle wheel and a regular bike tire on the street. A little while after the race, I cut it in half and stacked it up for Burning Man. The rear bike wheel failed at Burning Man and Don Cain (of the DSC) welded a motorized scooter to the back and drove it around all week. The motorcycle rear end replaced the broken rear and a jack shaft replaced the transitional "bike hub transmission" and it's been going solid since. It also has a shopping cart trailer that pulls a fire cannon capable of shooting 20-30 foot flames. 10 gallon propane capacity. Since 2007 it has been "gifted" to Kiki Stockhammer at Burning Man as her primary mode of transportation. She decorates it with fur and gnomes and has been known to chase DPW vehicles. So, if you see a dolled-up redhead riding this, it's not stolen.

### **American Gothic:**

A tall trike made specifically for the Burning Man environment. It has an old pitchfork welded into the framework of old bicycles, mostly because it was laying around and looked funny! It features comfortable recumbent seating for riding / watching art and the single front wheel drive pulls OKAY through soft-ish playa. The rear steering is a little twitchy and will toss you every now and then, but that makes it harder to steal. It has a basket to carry a cooler / jacket / goggles, etc. Also has a mounting point for an umbrella in the daytime. Fire for lighting at night and can pull a fire cannon trailer.

### **The Tiller:**

Has been reclaimed for parts because of a cracked / bent frame, but since it is by far the weirdest build so far, I thought I should include it. It had a 3 foot drainpipe wheel for the rear axle drive. The side wheel steers and the front wheel trails, like a shopping cart. Worked great on hard packed and street at low speeds. A little rough in the soft playa, it wanted to turn right when it hit soft stuff, actually "tilling" with the steer wheel.
